CLUB HISTORY OF COMMUNITY SERVICE

The Kiwanis Club of Ann Arbor was organized on May 13, 1921, and chartered on June 13, 1921, with 60 charter members. As of September 30, 2015, the club was the largest Kiwanis club in Michigan, with 155 members. Since its founding, the club has inducted 1222 members.

In 1922 the club began working with the University of Michigan Hospital to provide recreation and education for young patients. In 1934 this activity was adopted as a Michigan District project and named for Forney W. Clement, a former District Secretary and member of our club. Subsequently, the project was extended to Mary Free Bed Hospital in Grand Rapids (1961), Northern Michigan Hospitals, Inc. in Petoskey (1977), and Children's Hospital of Michigan in Detroit (1980s). Our club members make an annual gift to the Michigan District to support the Clement project at these four hospitals, and also contribute monthly to the Mott Pot to provide additional support to for the Clement project at the U of M Mott Children's Hospital.

Proceeds from rummage sales and other fund-raising efforts have enabled the club to fund the activities of many charitable organizations. Most club donations range between \$500 and \$4000. The club has made a few major gifts of \$5000 to \$25,000 to several community organizations to help support their activities.

The club has also participated in projects that benefit people outside the local area: Examples include:

- * collected and mailed boxes of clothing to Poland, Dominican Republic, and Nigeria
- * collected and sent boxes of prescription eyeglasses to Third World countries
- * donated \$104,000 to the worldwide Iodine Deficiency Disorder project sponsored by KI
- * donated \$103,185 in 2015 to the Kiwanis/unicef worldwide ELIMINATE project to eliminate maternal and neonatal tetanus.

CLUB MEMBERSHIP

Those who join our club are invited to join by current members. The weekly Monday-noon meetings are an excellent forum for prospective members to meet club members. The club covers the cost of two meals for each prospective member.

Members who wish to sponsor prospective members ask them to fill out and sign a Membership Application form. Sponsors sign the form and return it to the Secretary. The Secretary arranges for information about the applicant to be published in two consecutive issues of the Club Newsletter, and forwards the completed application to the facilitator of the Past Presidents, who arranges for the applicant to be interviewed by a Past President.

After an interviewer recommends acceptance of the application, the Secretary submits the application to the Board of Directors for approval. After the Board's approval, the Secretary notifies the applicant and requests payment of dues. Upon payment of dues, the Secretary places a new-member badge in the badge rack, and the President schedules a formal induction ceremony, with the applicant and sponsor present.

Annual club dues for 2015-2016 are \$180. Sponsors mentor new members to help them complete several tasks required to earn a regular-member badge. New members qualify for the regular -member badge once they:

- have been oriented about the club
- have their picture taken by the club photographer
- work on a sale activity
- join a committee
- give a 3-minute speech about themselves
- actively work on a club committee
- participate in two additional club activities, such as:
 - * greet guests and members at a noon meeting
 - * attend a Board meeting
 - * attend an interclub
- participate in at least one Kiwanis-sponsored community activity, such as:
 - * Warm The Children program
 - * Salvation Army bell ringing
 - * Meals on Wheels delivery

How To Maintain Perfect Attendance

A member who chooses to maintain perfect attendance can do so by attending all regularly scheduled club meetings or by making up missed meetings. One member participation credit may be earned for personal attendance at the following meetings or activities during the calendar month or 7 days immediately preceding or following the month that a club meeting is missed:

- a regular, round-table, Board, or special meeting of any other Kiwanis-family club
- a regular (not a special) meeting of our club's Board of Directors
- a regular, scheduled meeting of one of our club's formal committees
- a service project of our club or of a Kiwanis-family organization sponsored by our club (maximum of 1 credit/day/project)
- an international, district, or division Board meeting, convention, conference, or scheduled meeting (maximum of 1 credit per event)
- a club function held to improve the health, welfare, morale, or esprit de corps of club members (maximum of 1 credit/month)
- absence from a regular club meeting as a result of travel to or from an international or district convention or conference (travel must be within 7 days before or after the event)
- a visit to the international office, a regional service center, or a district office (maximum of 1 credit/quarter)
- one credit is given for each regular meeting missed as a result of performing jury duty

THE KIWANIS CENTER DOWNTOWN

The evolution of the distinct beige, brick warehouse and flour mill on the southwest corner of First and Washington Streets into a weekly beehive of activity is a tribute to the foresight and dedication to community service by the members and volunteers of the Kiwanis Club of Ann Arbor. On April 11, 1966, the club voted unanimously to purchase the building (which contained 22,000 sq. ft. of floor space) that once housed the Swisher Wholesale Grocery Store and then the Sears Roebuck & Co. Farm Store. The purchase was made possible through the generosity of John E. Swisher, Jr., whose father was a past president of the club (1925), and through contributions from club members and people in the local community. The club renamed the building the Kiwanis Activities Center. Later, in 2015, the name of the building was changed again to the Kiwanis Center Downtown (KCD).

In 1967, improvements to the KCD included pouring a concrete floor basement, constructing a stairway to the two floors above the basement, installing restrooms and interior lighting, painting, and remodeling (including the laying out of a shuffleboard on the top floor). In February 1968, the KCD hosted its first club sales event. The building featured space for selling and storing merchandise, and rooms for holding the club's weekly Monday noon meetings and other activities. These have become traditional uses of the building.

On Thursday, February 4, 1982, a sale was disrupted when a section of the roof over what is now the kitchen buckled under the weight of snow. No one was injured; the sale was resumed on the next day. In May 1983, the club began seeking financial support from the community to renovate the building -- a \$100,000 undertaking. The rear of the KCD, formerly a flour mill, was renovated inside and out, including protective exterior siding, and the second floor was extended the full length of the building to create more storage space and selling area.

During 2000-2002, the club invested \$310,000 (a bequest from Vincent Vis) to improve the building's efficiency, assure the safety and comfort of workers and customers, and improve accessibility to handicapped persons. Major items in the completed project included:

- an upgraded electrical and fire alarm system throughout the building
- the addition of heating and cooling to spaces lacking temperature control
- a new telephone and security system
- new flooring and added sales space on the mezzanine
- installation of a new bathroom with handicapped access
- conversion of the freight elevator to accommodate handicapped persons

The cost of these improvements was paid from unrestricted bequests from members and friends of the club. The purchase of, and improvements to, the KCD have proved to be a wise investment for the club and the local community. Many customers think of the KCD as the convenient place where "the biggest garage sale in town" is held every Saturday morning. The proceeds from those sales enable the club to help many organizations that serve needy individuals and families. In 2009-2010 the club invested \$13,000 to improve the decor and lighting on the top floor.

In 2015, there was a major reorganization and reallocation of floor space for the various sales departments in the KCD that was made possible by the club's purchase of the Kiwanis Center West and the large expansion of sales space that acquisition brought about.

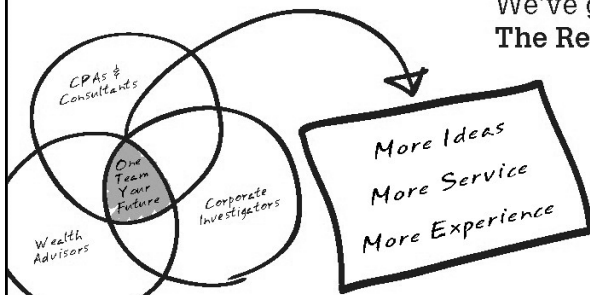
THE KIWANIS CENTER WEST

In 2014, the club's Foundation purchased a 17.4-acre property, including a 123,000 sq-ft office and warehouse building, located at 100 North Staebler Road, at a cost of \$2.25 million. Following \$250,000 of renovations, the facility opened as Kiwanis Center West (KCW) on June 13, 2015, initially for Saturday sales; later that year, sales were expanded to include Fridays and Saturdays from 9 AM to 1 PM.

The new, KCW sales floor covers approximately 30,000 sq-ft with an additional 20,000 sq-ft of warehouse space designated for Kiwanis inventory storage. Another 20,000 of warehouse space at KCW is rented to other organizations, while the previous owner of the property, Sheridan Books, rents back 20,000 sq-ft of office space. Seven and one-half acres of undeveloped wet lands on the property has been designated as the Ann Arbor Kiwanis Environmental Education Preserve (AAKEEP). Another 2.5-acre portion of the property fronting on Jackson Road may be sold as a commercial lot.

In 2011 Kiwanis International (KI) established the Walter Zeller Fellowship to commemorate Walter Zeller, who made the first gift of 25 silver dollars to establish the KI Foundation. The Zeller Fellowship recognizes a gift of at least \$1,250 to the ELIMINATE Project, an undertaking to raise \$110 million by 30 September 2015 to eliminate maternal neonatal tetanus in mothers and newborns in countries where this disease remains a threat.

On 22 August 2011, our Club membership pledged to donate \$100,000 to the KI worldwide ELIMINATE Project by 30 September 2015, a goal we met and exceeded by raising \$103,185. The names of Zeller Fellows are permanently displayed on a board on the top floor of the Kiwanis Activities Center. CLUB FUND-RAISING AND GIVING

The Kiwanis Club of Ann Arbor began raising money in 1925 by selling newspapers. In 1927 it teamed with King's Daughters, a local church guild, to hold periodic three-day rummage sales in vacant stores and, from 1948 to 1967, in the National Guard Armory. From February 1968 through 1990, sales were held in the Kiwanis Center Downtown (KCD) periodically, thence weekly on Saturday mornings. In January of 2012, through the generosity of Don Butcher, a former club member, and Jake Haas, the club acquired the use of an 8000-sq-ft warehouse at 840 Airport Plaza Dr. Furniture and other large items were stored and sold there on Saturdays. Then, in 2014, the club's Foundation purchased a 17.4-acre lot, including a warehouse and office complex, located at 100 North Staebler Road, which became the Kiwanis Center West (KCW). Regular Saturday sales began at KCW on June 13, 2015. Currently, 47-48 weeks of the year, the Kiwanis Thrift Sale is open at KCD from 9 AM to noon on Saturdays only and at KCW from 9 AM to 1 PM on Fridays and Saturdays.

The vital, material input to the Thrift Sales is provided by individuals and organizations who donate merchandise, either by dropping off items at KCD and KCW or through the pickup service that the club provides. Club members, volunteers and employees then sort, price, display, and sell donated items. This work often requires conscientious sorting, creative merchandising, and tact. A sorter once found \$660 in an article of clothing; occasionally bills are found hidden in books. Items sold include automobiles, store mannequins, live piglets, tombstones, boats, and organs (musical). Once, four people bought the same sofa on the same day and showed up simultaneously to claim it. Someone mistakenly donated a neighbor's dishes. Members and volunteers have had their own coats and jackets inadvertently sold during a sale. The most successful single sale, a three-day event in 1985, grossed \$80,234. Between fiscal years 2006-07 and 2014-15, annual gross sales, including warehouse and eBay sales, have increased from \$223,000 to over \$545,102.

Over the years the club has found additional ways to raise funds. It sells donated vehicles through a licensed dealer. It began selling selected items on eBay in 2002, and on craigslist in 2011. On these electronic sites, a few unusual items have sold for hundreds of dollars to more than one thousand dollars. In early January 2011, the club began selling surplus clothing and shoes to City Recyclers. This firm picks up the merchandise at the KCD, sorts it, and sends it to developing countries for use by citizens there. Recently, the acquisition of KCW provides additional income to the club's Foundation from rental of office and warehouse space to third parties, both commercial and non-profits.

Since 1927 the club's charitable Foundation has netted over \$4.5 million from its Thrift Sales. The Foundation devotes all net sale proceeds to support many projects of charitable organizations that serve the local community and Washtenaw County. The success of the sale depends on the hard work of many club members and dozens of volunteers.

In addition to donating money to charitable organizations, the Foundation gives merchandise to needy individuals and families through its Direct Assistance Program. The club's Community Services Committee administers this program in cooperation with participating local social agencies. The Committee distributes about \$35,000 worth of merchandise annually to qualified clients of social agencies that serve the greater Ann Arbor community. Each year, the Foundation also grants scholarships to college-bound high school graduates from Ann Arbor as well as residential Summer Camperships to children and youth of Washtenaw County. The Foundation also donates clothing to people in need worldwide, especially to orphanages and countries that have suffered natural disasters. The club's International Relations Committee coordinates the distribution of these donated items. Annually, the Thrift Sale's Book Department donates thousands of surplus children's books to teachers and libraries of K-12 schools in Ann Arbor and Detroit.

Through all of these programs combined, the club's Foundation has donated over \$2,482,000 in money and merchandise to charities and individuals, since 2004.

HIXSON FELLOWS

Kiwanis International (KI) established the George F. Hixson Fellowship in 1983 to honor its first president. Fellows are selected in one of two ways. First, members of a club, upon making a lump-sum payment of at least \$1000 to the KI Foundation, may designate recipients during their lifetimes or posthumously. Second, a club itself may designate a recipient (e.g., a Club member or her/his spouse) by making a lump-sum payment of at least \$1000 to the KI Foundation.

To be considered for a Hixson Fellowship sponsored by our Club, a member must demonstrate exceptional dedication to the Club and its Objects during the course of a single year. This may be achieved in various ways, such as excellence as chair of a committee, outstanding success in recruiting, extraordinary involvement by a new member, or other comparable contributions to the Club. In exceptional circumstances, the Club may award a Fellowship to a nonmember, provided that the designee has made a contribution to the community commensurate with the Club's standards for Honorary Member status or has made a singular contribution of time and effort to the Club.

During three administrative years (1996-1999), our Club donated a total of \$104,000 to KI for the Worldwide Iodine Deficiency Disorder program. Consequently, KI extended to our Club the privilege of awarding several dozen Hixson Fellowships because of those donations. Upon the recommendation of the Member Recognition Committee and approval by the Board, the names of Fellows are permanently displayed in the Kiwanis Center Downtown. GENERAL CHARGES TO CLUB COMMITTEES

Attendance & Reception: Greets members as they arrive for noon meetings and records their names for attendance records.

Budget & Finance: Develops annual budgets for the Club and Foundation.

Building & Equipment: Oversees the maintenance, security, safety, and long-range planning for the KCD and KCW building, equipment, facilities, and vehicles.

Bylaws: Recommends changes to the Club and Foundation bylaws, and updates the Club and Foundation Manuals of Administrative Policies and Procedures.

Children & Youth Services: Initiates projects that benefit children and youth from birth to age 18, grants funds to organizations that serve children and youth, awards college and music scholarships, and awards summer camperships.

Community Services: Grants funds to organizations that provide a variety of services that fill important community needs, and administers the Club's Direct Assistance program.

Fines: Proposes fines and encourages others to do so at noon meetings; collects fines.

Grant Policy: Oversees and administers the Club Foundation's grant-application process, and facilitates disbursements of grants.

Greater Years: Initiates projects that benefit seniors, and grants funds to agencies that serve seniors.

Honorary Members Selection: Nominates for Honorary Club Membership willing community-minded citizens who exemplify the ideals of Kiwanis in their personal and business lives. Oversees the annual induction ceremony for Honorary Members and Honored Volunteers.

Hospitality: Informs membership about births, deaths, illnesses, accidents, hospitalizations, and special events that involve current and past members and their families. Sends cards or flowers as appropriate.

Human & Spiritual Values: Plans and executes programs designed to increase the awareness of non-denominational religious and spiritual values. Awards grants to agencies that support spiritual development, provide human companionship and comfort, and support grief counseling. Oversees the annual Salvation Army bell-ringing project.

Interclubs: Encourages exchange visits to other Kiwanis clubs. Ensures that the Club completes at least two interclubs each month, including all Superinterclubs.

International Relations: Promotes the development of understanding and friendship among nations, and awards grants to agencies that support that objective.

Investment Oversight: Manages the invested reserve funds of the Club's Foundation.

Kiwanis Environment Education Program (KEEP): Designs and implements a plan that makes the Kiwanis Center property (100 Staebler Rd at Jackson Rd) suitable for research and environmental education opportunities, especially for elementary- and middle-school students.

K-Family Leadership Programs: Fosters the establishment, growth, maintenance, and continuation of K-Kids, Builders, Key, Circle K, and Aktion Clubs.

Kiwanis of Michigan Foundation: Educates the membership about the role of KMF in serving children who are patients at the four hospitals supported by KMF.

GENERAL CHARGES TO CLUB COMMITTEES, *continued*

Long-Range Planning: Anticipate, and plan for, future needs for facilities, resources, and new operating requirements of the Foundation.

Meals on Wheels: Delivers meals to the frail, elderly, and disabled, Monday through Friday throughout the year, on Routes 9 & 11; assists with other routes as appropriate.

Marketing: Communicates the activities and accomplishments of the Club and Foundation (including sales) while adhering to the Publication Guidelines.

Member Recognition: Provides appropriate recognition to members whose contributions have helped the Club achieve its Kiwanis objectives. Oversees attendant award ceremonies.

Membership Digest: Updates the Membership Digest and arranges for its annual publication.

Membership Growth & Education: Develops and implements strategies to recruit, orient, educate, and retain Club members.

Newsletter: Prepares the weekly Club Newsletter for distribution to Club members.

Nominating: Nominates willing members to stand for election as Club officers (except Secretary) and Directors. Prepares and counts ballots at the Club's annual meeting.

Personnel: Develops, implements, and monitors all personnel policies of the Club and Foundation, subject to the approval by the Board.

Photographer: Takes digital photographs at noon meetings and other Club events, and distributes them to the Newsletter and Website Committees.

Programs: Schedules speakers for noon meetings and Club members to introduce them.

Sale Management Oversight: Develops policies and implements procedures for managing all aspects of weekly sales, including sales on eBay. Schedules Club members and volunteers to sort merchandise and staff the weekly sales.

Social: Plans and implements periodic social events that foster camaraderie among Club members, volunteers, friends, and family members.

Website: Provides an online platform (website and selected social media) for managing information and promoting the Club and Foundation (including sales).
