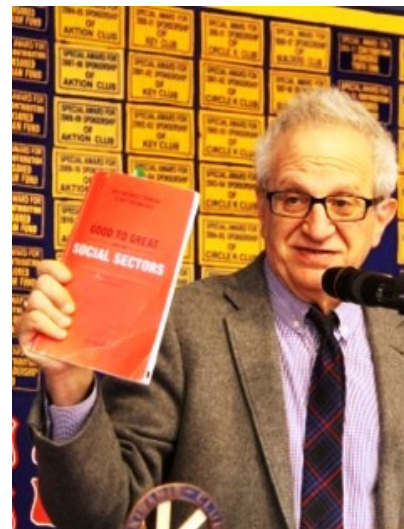

Dr. Rob Pasick has been a Clinical and Organizational Psychologist and Executive Coach since 1975 when he earned his Ph. D from the Michigan of the East. He is the author of six books, and has appeared on "Oprah" and "The Today Show." Rob is the founder of Leaders Connect and CEO Connect and is an affiliate faculty member at the U-M. Rob owes a lot of his success to being a member of a Kiwanis sponsored baseball team during his formative years.



Rob spoke about the book "Good to Great" which focused on for-profit companies, but he said there are also similar measurements of success for non-profit organizations like Kiwanis. One of the most important is that **contributors want to know that the time and money that they donate to a non-profit is making a difference.** All non profits are competing for an individual's time and money. Therefore we (and similar organizations) need to find a way to educate the community and publicize what we are accomplishing. 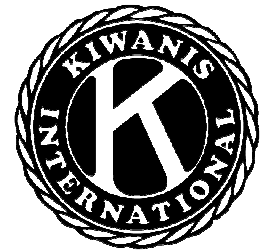

Other News...

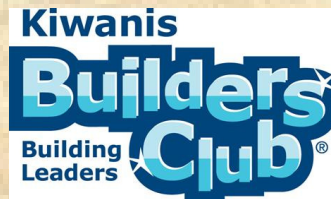
Key Club International is Kiwanis' oldest and largest continuing youth-service program. The first Key Club ("for key boys") was organized by the Kiwanis Club of Sacramento, California, in 1925. The concept of a service club for high school (or secondary students ages 14–18) spread to other Kiwanis clubs, and Key Club became an official program of Kiwanis International in 1942. Today, more than 250,000 young men and women belong to Key Clubs in more than 5,000 high schools throughout the U.S., Canada, and a growing number of other nations. Key Club International is run largely by its members, who conduct conventions and elect officers each year at the district and international levels.
