Today's Program...

Alan Burg introduced Christina Kim and Omari Rush from Next Generation Philanthropists founded in 2008 with 12 members and having grown to 35 members in 2012. The group's mission is to engage young philanthropists in understanding A2. Each member donates \$500 per year plus their time in doing community needs assessment, awarding grants, and doing volunteer work. Members bring a grant seeking community organization before the group's monthly meeting for consensus approval. Grants have ranged from \$500 to \$10,000. Christina notes that as they have aged (they are now in their 30-40s) they are no longer young but rather "youngish." Members also serve on various non-profit boards and work community events. Omari added that they are always looking for new ways to serve, creating support networks, sharing and learning asking for enlightenment (but make it quick). Knowing that it is not all work but also fun, members enjoy participating in events and festivals. Members are also active in the political arena. The idea is to make a difference. Q & A asked--why A2 and why now? Christina and Omari answered, we are project oriented, dividing our non work time 1/2 to social networking and 1/2 to service projects, wanting to stay empowered, stay involved, make friends, encourage cultural vitality, learn and grow with peers but also placing value on intergenerational opportunities. What attracts them? a one on one relationship.
