Today's Program...

Our speaker was Joan Doughty, Community Action Network (CAN) Executive Director. She was introduced by **Kathy Griswold.** CAN is an amazing organization. Their mission is to assist children in the Ann Arbor area who are born into poverty. They operate 4 community centers; Hikone, Bryant, and Northside Community Centers and Green Baxter Courts and provide many support services.

- A back-to-school barbecue every August. Each child gets a new backpack
 - After school programs providing homework help, tutoring (by college student-role models), and enrichment activities
 - Reading programs including over-the-summer, to prevent back-sliding (virtually all children involved graduate from H.S.)
 - Evening meals during after-school programs; about 15,000 meals/year
 - Social/emotional support through interaction with pet animals; Zoo visit, Humane Society fund raiser, reading to dogs
 - Free onsite summer day camps with 1 hour academic work per day
 - Food pantries for families in need
 - Youth Works summer employment opportunities
 - Housing stabilization; financial assistance to prevent evictions (no families evicted in 12 years)
 - Help running elections for representatives at public housing sites
 - Santa visits at Christmas
 - An annual yard sale at Bryant (Saturday June 7 this year); donations very welcome. Contact CAN to donate or help with cleanup Saturday June 14
 - Helped obtain government grant to improve drainage at the Bryant site
- Fitness and exercise events such as 3 on 3 basketball tournaments
