Today's Program...



Claire Dahl presided over the awarding of the Hunter/Clague, Carpenter, Henne, Smith/Gray, Naylor, and the Ray & Eleanor Cross Foundation Scholarships. Ralph Hunter was a Chemist at Dow Chemical. He was also a Kiwanian and a strong supporter of education. Ashley Clague was a highly respected Ann Arbor School Administrator. The Reverend Charles Carpenter led the Second Baptist Church and strongly promoted racial and ethnic tolerance. Walter Henne was a devoted Kiwanian who helped start Key Clubs in several Ann Arbor High Schools. The three scholarships funded by Smith/Gray are the result of an endowment gift from Susan M. Smith in 2011 for scholarships. Don Naylor started Naylor Motors car dealership and had perfect attendance for 26 years.

Jim Couch presided over the awarding of the Ray and Eleanor Cross Foundation Scholarships which were funded entirely by the foundation. Ray Cross was an internationally known expert in water quality and headed the Culligan Water Company in Ann Arbor for many years. His financial legacies support Saint Andrews Church, the Ann Arbor Symphony Orchestra and Kiwanis scholarships, having given about \$150,000, to date, for scholarships. Jim also presided over the presentation of scholarships resulting from the collaboration between members of the Kiwanis Club and the Ray & Eleanor Cross Foundation.



Dr. Jeanice Kerr Swift, Superintendent of the Ann Arbor Public School System, congratulated scholarship recipients, their parents, and their teachers and councilors for the academic success of the students. 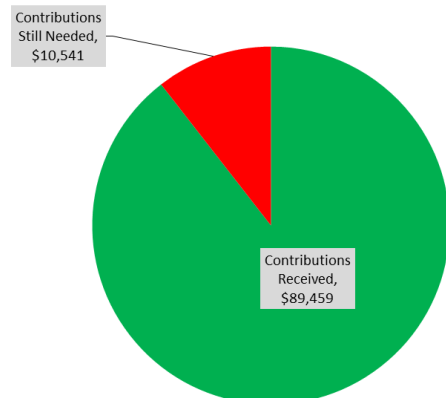
