Today's Program...

University of Michigan Community Relations:



Jim Kosteva

Jim Kosteva, Director of Community Relations at the University of Michigan spoke about the many interactions that the University has with the city and local area. He said that they are exploring the construction of a light rail system that would link the North Campus area, downtown and central campus, the athletic campus, and eventually the Briarwood Mall area. He said that there are 35,000 daily, University related, commutes in this corridor. This proposed rail system is intended to reduce automobile traffic and commute times in the area. This proposal, at an estimated cost of between \$500 and \$700 million is favored over adding 40 to 50 more busses. Fortunately for project funding, the federal government also favors light rail projects.

Jim said that the University does \$1.3 Billion in research annually, which leads to 400 patentable ideas each year, and about one new startup venture each month. He also said that they are looking forward to celebrating the University's 200th anniversary next year. For further information, please see the UM Community Relations website at this [link](#).

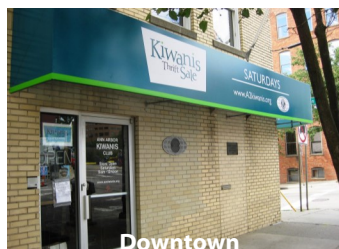
