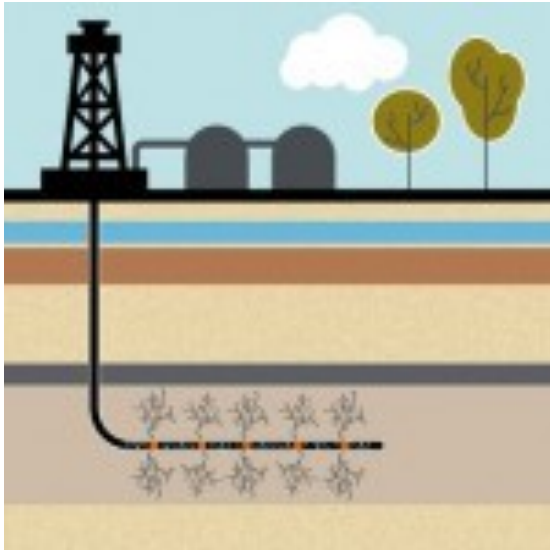

**TODAY'S PROGRAM CONTINUED FROM PAGE 1...**



Do people love it or hate it? Yes, both. It's not so simple as you might expect. Many people live quite happily in oil and gas production areas. But he also pointed out that even many in favor of oil and gas production in general can have a nuanced view regarding its development in specific "sensitive" areas, even in Texas, for example, and may oppose it. It's complicated and may depend on the economic need of the populations found in these areas. As you talk to people further away from production areas, how they feel may depend more on which political party they identify with. There have been instances of wells contaminated with methane, the main component of natural gas, that while not actually poisonous, can accumulate and cause fires and/or explosions.

This problem has been traced to faulty well casings. Even in areas where problems like this have occurred, there can be wide differences of opinion as to whether fracking should continue.

As to whether it is good or bad for climate change, he summarized by saying that it will neither be a hero or a villain. With the increase in the production of oil and natural gas associated with fracking has come a very large reduction in the use of coal in the production of energy. The emission of CO2 due to the use of coal has been reduced to 1992 levels. On the other hand, oil from shale production competes with nuclear, wind, and solar production which will be needed in the future to reduce CO2 emissions even further. It appears that fracking has not permanently altered the situation for better or worse.

It was a very interesting and informative presentation and you might pick up his book for more information.

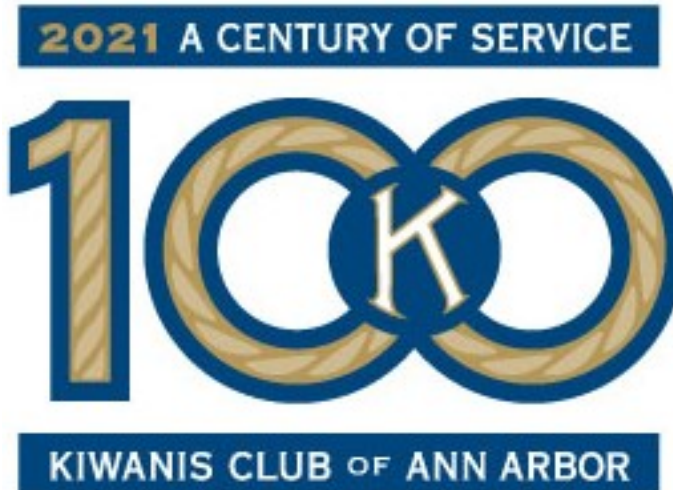
