TODAY'S PROGRAM...

FLIGHT OF THE BUTTERFLIES

Dale Leslie introduced our guest speaker Manja Holland PhD, and her colleague Jennifer Fike, from the Great Lakes Region of the National Wildlife Federation, which is housed here in Ann Arbor. Manja Holland, a community educator, spoke about Global Pollinator Decline. Accompanied by slides, Ms. Holland described the crucial role pollinators play in our food supply: one third of our food is dependent upon pollinators... primarily honeybees. Honeybees in hives are actually trucked about the country to pollinate crops. Seventy percent of this effort is directed toward the almond industry in California. Honeybees are not native to the United States, having come from Europe.

Ms. Holland went on to say, however, "You're worrying about the wrong bees". Native bees, like the bumblebee, play a huge role in pollinating plants, especially those that wildlife depends upon. Of the 4000 types of native bees in the US, 50% have declined significantly. This decline is attributed to habitat loss, use of pesticides, disease, decreased diversity in native and cultured plants, and climate change. The loss of pollinators in China has led to humans pollinating plants by hand one flower at a time, an unimaginable situation.

Ms. Holland then talked about butterflies, especially Monarchs, which have declined in number by 90% in the last twenty years. The critical food for Monarchs is milkweed, which the caterpillars consume. The same factors that have diminished the bee population affect the Monarch butterflies as well. Southern Michigan is a major flyover/stopover for Monarchs on their northern flight. They also cluster along Lake Michigan as seen by **Sally Lamkin** near their summer home.

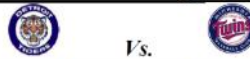

Ms. Holland concluded this fascinating program with ideas for helping pollinators, including Monarch butterflies: plant butterfly weed or common milkweed in patches, allow clover and dandelions in your lawn, mow less frequently... once every two weeks, reduce turf grass and increase native plants, create season-long sequence of blooms. Most importantly, eliminate use of pesticides that include neonicotinoid, which is deadly for pollinators. This program generated many questions and comments. Resources for those who want more information include: www.xerces.org for information about pesticide brands to avoid; www.nwf.org/garden for information on creating a sustainable garden for wildlife.



Following the meeting Dan Dever, pulled out drawings of the KEEP and engaged Manja Holland in a discussion possibilities in our KEEP. We will do our part!

HOW YOU CAN HELP

1. Avoid using neonicotinoids in your garden or yard. Read the label to determine whether a product contains neonicotinoids; look out for imidacloprid, acetamiprid, dinotefuran, clothianidin, and thiamethoxam.
2. When purchasing plants, ask nursery or garden center staff if the plants were treated with neonicotinoids.
3. Encourage your city or park district to use alternatives to neonicotinoids on plants that are bee-visited (e.g., maple trees) or bee-pollinated (e.g., linden trees, roses).
4. Create patches of pesticide-free, pollinator-friendly flowers in your garden or neighborhood. For lists of suitable plants, visit www.xerces.org.
5. Share this information with your neighbors and local community!
6. Show your commitment to providing safe pollinator habitat by signing the Xerces Society's Bring Back the Pollinators pledge. Visit www.bringbackthepollinators.org

- Scholarships: **Dan Burroughs** reported that the Scholarship Committee had met again and modified the decision about requiring recipients to attend a school in Michigan. The wording now indicates preference will be given to students planning to attend an institution in Michigan. **Dan** went on to say that the rationale for this preference is to support students who may not have financial resources to consider out of state schools. (See below for a list of schools chosen by last year's recipients; thank you, **Claire Dahl**, for providing this information). Our program next week will presented by the Ann Arbor Area Community Foundation and their new process for awarding grants, especially scholarships. A process we might want to use going forward. The scholarship amount has been increased to \$1,500 each, with the Cross Foundation matching each \$750 gift from an individual or group. The Kiwanis Club of Ann Arbor Foundation plans to award \$150,000 in grants to children and family service agencies in the greater Ann Arbor area. The grants will be awarded this spring.

The Kiwanis Club of Ann Arbor Foundation has completed the sale of its downtown building and the payoff of its mortgage on its new building, which makes possible the expansion of its community gifting. The \$150,000 in grants from the Kiwanis Club of Ann Arbor Foundation represents a return to Kiwanis' annual granting process to service agencies that was not available during the last two years.

Kiwanis has recently consolidated and expanded the Kiwanis Thrift Sale at its much larger building at 100 North Staebler Rd, just off West Jackson Rd on the west side of Ann Arbor. The Kiwanis Thrift Sale is currently open on Fridays and Saturdays from 9 am to 1 pm.

The Thrift Sale profits create funds for Kiwanis's annual grant process. Additional funds are raised each year through the direct financial support of individual Kiwanians for high school and middle school scholarships and summer camperships. The Kiwanis Thrift Sale also donates household items and merchandize to families in need valued at approximately \$115,000 annually.
