#### Hixson Fellows Awards

**Robert Carr** served as master of ceremonies of our special Hixson Fellows award ceremony. Bob laid the foundation for the award presentations by explaining that Kiwanis International established the George F. Hixson Fellowship in the 1980s to honor the first president of Kiwanis International. A club member, or a club itself, may designate a Hixson Fellowship recipient by making a gift of \$1,000 to the Kiwanis International Foundation. In the late 1990s, our club raised \$104,000 for donation to the Kiwanis International Foundation toward the worldwide Iodine Deficiency Disorder program. More recently, our club raised \$107,000 for The Eliminate Project (Kiwanis eliminating maternal and neonatal tetanus). Because of these substantial contributions, our club has "banked" a number of Hixson Fellowship designations, and four very deserving new recipients were named and honored as today's program.
