TODAY'S PROGRAM...

Flint Water Crisis



Dr. Nancy Love

Garry Evans introduced our speaker for the day, Dr. Nancy Love. She has her PhD from Clemson and is a Board Certified Environmental Engineer. She also is a Borchardt and Glysson Collegiate Professor at the University of Michigan. Her topic of her presentation was : Water Infrastructure in Shrinking and Expanding Cities: The Impact on Water Quality and Public Health." She began by giving us a general overview of US water infrastructure saying that it is complex, invisible and old. The consumer price index for water has increased greatly in recent ears, much higher than the average while federal contribution to water infrastructure has plummeted, leaving costs up to state and local governments. This leaves many US cities very susceptible to water main breaks as systems keep aging (over 240,000 annually that have been reported). We are in a situation currently where 12% of Americans struggle to pay their water bills with rates expected to triple in the coming years. Dr. Love then started speaking specifically about Flint and their water crisis

and how many areas are facing severe blight and decreased people living in certain areas which causes the water age to increase (this is how long water sits in pipes in the ground before it is delivered for use to a faucet). Water age is supposed to max at 72 hours but sits in pipes in some places in Flint and other cities with decreasing population for much longer – up to three weeks! Increased water age can cause chemical issues with water quality, biological issues as well as physical issues. Much of these problems have occurred in the Chevy Commons area where there used to be a lot of activity due to Chevrolet's presence there. Activity has decreased and an aging water system has continued to age and, not surprisingly, a blood lead level map when placed directly over the water age map coincides perfectly. There has been a flip since a study was done in 2003-2004 from gastroenteritis-related sickness due to contaminated water which now in 2011-2012 presents as legionnaires disease (a form of pneumonia). This is problematic because this type of response to contaminated water is not required to be monitored (although it is done more so currently). One response to helping reduce problems with aging systems is to have a multiple barrier system which can include a point of use filter which is great for reducing lead (a filter on your faucet – ie Pur or Brita). However, these filters do not account for disinfection. In order to do that, a person would have to boil water or use a UV lamp. **Today's Program Continued on Page 3**

Dr. Love also does a lot of research in Addis Ababa in Ethiopia and she spoke briefly about their problems which includes heavily polluted ground water and a shortage of available water. Normally, people in rural areas have to jerry can water or have a spout near their house. There are many large developments going up in the city which have central water but they have an issue with water pressure and so the top floors can’t get it and are having to jerry can water even further and have stagnation issues. Dr. Love’s talk was very enlightening and helped us to understand more about the Flint Water Crisis and how it came to be. Thank you for your time, Dr. Love!

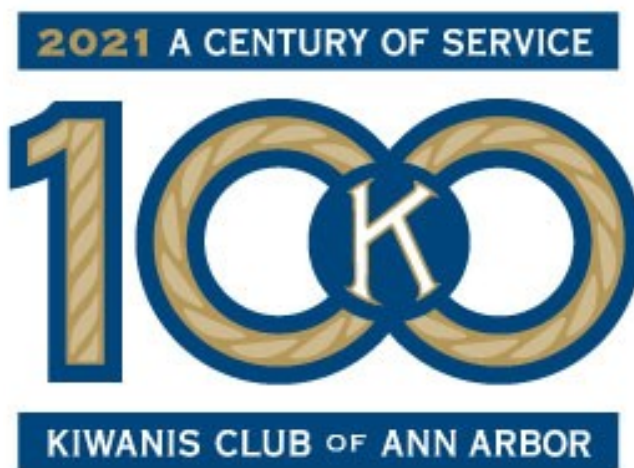
