TODAY'S PROGRAM

Mueller and the Tools of the Federal Prosecutor

Kathie Wilder introduced our speaker for the day, Barbara McQuade, a professor of law and former US Attorney for the Eastern District of Michigan (being the first woman to serve in that position). She is a 1991 graduate of the University of Michigan Law School (Go Blue!). Her presentation was titled, "The Mueller Investigation and the Tools of the Federal Prosecutor."

Barbara wanted to give us an overview of the investigation while filling us in on some of the tools that a prosecutor uses in a case like this one. Rod Rosenstein, current US Deputy Attorney General is presiding over the investigation to avoid a conflict of interest and he has appointed Robert Mueller as special counsel charged with investigating links between Russian interference in the election and Trump campaign, matters that may arise in the investigation and any perjury or obstruction of justice that occurs in the course of the investigation. Barbara got to know Robert Mueller as she had the privilege of prosecuting some cases with him and says that he is a traditionalist and always wears a white shirt! You won't see him on any day in casual clothing!

There have been 32 charges to date including 3 corporate entities being charged and several spinoff investigations have arisen. Several charges have been against these key players: Paul Manafort, Richard Gates, Konstantin Kilimnik, Michael Flynn, George Papadopoulos, the Internet Research Agency which includes the corporate defendants and 13 Russian Nationals and also 12 Russian Intelligence Officers, Richard Pinedo and Alex vander zwaan. Charges range from witness tampering, false statements, identity fraud, conspiracy to defraud the US by interfering with the administrations of elections, hacking and more.

She then moved into explaining the tools that a prosecutor has in their toolbox.

- Search Warrants: require a knock and announce before entering, requires probable cause, can be evaded by destroying evidence before warrant requested
- Searching attorney's offices: require more authorization because of Attorney-Client Privilege
- Searching Social Media and email: requires a warrant but once it's on Facebook, it's always there! Old information is archived and can be used in a trial.
- Border searches: no 4th amendment protection for warrants at the border, cell phones can be searched as well
- Grand Jury: subpoenas help to get reluctant witnesses to talk, still have 5th amendment right against self-incrimination and so prosecutors can grant immunity to lower level people involved in crimes saying that anything they say can't be used to incriminate them but against a higher level person in the case
- Cooperation: offering leniency in sentencing to defendants in response for their cooperation in the case as long as their statements can be corroborated. Flynn, Gates and Manafort have all cooperated thus far in the case.
- Orders: way to obtain someone's tax records with permission from the court and have to prove there is reasonable cause that a crime has been committed, the return info is relevant to the crime and this information can't be obtained from another source. Barbara speculates that Mueller has Trump's tax returns which he has not publicly released to date.
- FISA: Foreign Intelligence Surveillance Act 1978 – court reviews applications for surveillance in national security cases in secret. Court may issue orders to intercept oral or wire communications, physical searches, email, text, business records, phone records, etc.

When members of the Kiwanis Club of Pella, Iowa, first heard that hundreds of children in Uganda desperately wanted an education but didn't have the resources to participate, they knew they had to act. Education is key to breaking the cycle of poverty in many villages. Those who aren't able to continue school often marry early and are relegated to trying to survive on subsistence farming.



"My heart was broken with compassion imagining all of those children sitting on the perimeter of the school wishing they were able to attend," says Matthew Burch, the club's secretary. "I knew we had to do something."

The board approved US\$500 in initial financial support — which the club hopes to expand and continue annually — to Mission Uganda, which spent three weeks this past June visiting schools in Uganda to distribute uniforms and math sets, as well as funding for school meals.
