TODAY'S PROGRAM...Laugh Yoga

Today's Program: **Deb Jones** introduced our speaker for the day, Carolyn J. Christopher a Certified Laughter Yoga Professional. She is the founder and director of The Laughter Project. She has worked with groups numbering from 10 to 725 people. Working with her clients she ensure that expectations are exceeded and skeptics leave the session with smiles and an appreciation for laughter in their lives. She has been laughing all her life and was trained in Laughter Yoga in 2007 after a career as a project manager with HP ended in a buyout and she knew she could contribute to society in a positive way. The Laughter Project is committed to bringing more joy and laughter into the world by facilitating workshops, certifying new Laughter Leaders, sharing laughter with students and seniors, speaking at conferences and corporate events and coaching individuals. The Laughter Project provides a variety of services including team building, health fairs, kick-offs and after lunch doldrums program.

Carolyn highlighted 7 great qualities about laughter: 1. It's fun 2. It's endorsed by Dr. Madan Kataria, known as The Laughter Guru who invented Laughter Yoga (www.laughyoga.org) 3. It's free 4. It's for everyone. 5. It keeps the brain alive by generating endorphins when we laugh and also oxygenates your blood as you are inhaling/exhaling more while you're laughing 6. It tricks the brain 7. There are over 7,000 laughter clubs in over 72 countries around the world. Carolyn then began to lead our club in some Laughter Yoga, including breathing exercises, laughter exercises, chants, clapping exercises and singing. She highlighted many benefits of laughing on a daily basis including releasing endorphins (which make us happy), decreasing blood pressure, and helping people to build relationships.

❖ **President William** announced for the second week that the motion to adopt the KEEP (Kiwanis Environmental Education Preserve) as a multi-year project will go to vote of the general Kiwanis membership.
