TODAY'S PROGRAM...

Haiti Nurses Project

John Sampsele introduced today's guest, Thom Bales, Executive Director of the Haiti Nurses Project. Mr. Bales provided a presentation and answered questions describing the work of the Haiti Nursing Foundation in building and running a school for training nurses and other medical specialties in Haiti. He noted that Haiti's population suffers very high maternal and child death rates and has a adult life expectancy of only 63 years. Haiti has only 1.8 nurses per 10K citizens, about 1/10th of our North American average. Nearly 40% of Haitians have no access to health care services.

A school to teach nursing, using accepted international standards, can help meet the populations health needs. Ann Arbor's First Presbyterian Church helped to bring volunteer faculty leaders to the Foundation's new school in Haiti starting in January of 2005. Since then, the school has built new facilities, hired staff and graduated 175 women and men with Bachelor's of Science degrees in nursing, and another 16 graduates certified as family nurse practitioners. Almost all graduates have stayed in Haiti, bringing much needed medical care to their citizens.

OTHER NEWS...

Paul Klinger, a long-time Ann Arbor musician and a member of the **Kiwanis Club of Ann Arbor** for over 50 years (1966). A brief summary of his renowned career in brass appears in this 2010 Ann Arbor News article below;

*"In the world of jazz, musical groups come and go, form, reform and shuffle players with amazing regularity. So it's especially remarkable that Ann Arbor's **Easy Street Jazz Band** celebrated its 40th anniversary. The traditional jazz / swing ensemble, was founded and led by cornetist / soprano saxist **Paul Klinger**, "Jazz bands don't last that long," Klinger observed. "It's pretty noteworthy. We don't know exactly the particular day the band was formed. I'm sure there was a first gig, but nobody remembers it. "We were all involved in other bands. I played at (downtown Ann Arbor bar/restaurant) Bimbo's for many years; I was part of a Detroit based band called Mother's Boys that started about 1965. And everything overlapped. Sometime in 1970 was the start; we just generated a date to celebrate it," he added.*

Klinger said the group took its name from the Ann Arbor thoroughfare where he lived. "My folks built the house on Easy Street when I was in junior high. Later, I attended the U-M. I've always been in Ann Arbor; I never lived anywhere else. I'm a real townie, but a gownie too, because I worked for the U-M (he retired as a research associate at Mental Health Research Institute in 1999). He estimates that as many as 150 musicians have played or sat in with the band over the years, and said he expects several of them to be on hand Tuesday."

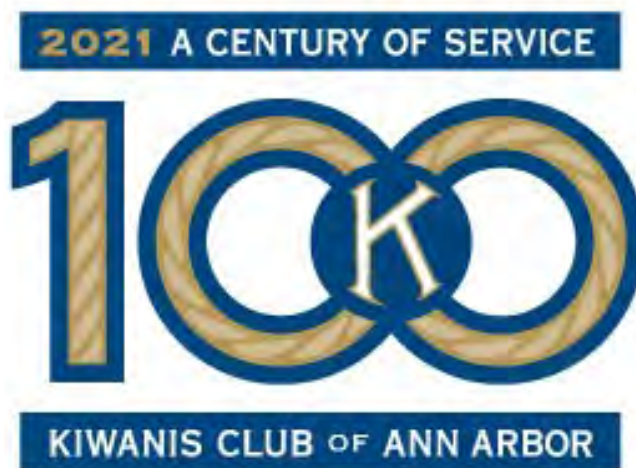
