Annual Scholarship Program

President William opened the meeting by saying this would be an abbreviated meeting for routine club business because we had more important things to do. He welcomed our guests and reminded them our door is always open to them as shoppers, volunteers, or future members. He said the most important thing we would do today was honor our student scholars because they are the future of this universe. He then introduced, and turned the program over to, his good friends **Peter Schork** and 'The AP Queen' **Claire Dahl**. William also let us know, in passing, that today is Willie Nelson's 85th birthday.

Claire Dahl began our Scholarship Awards program by telling us we are granting forty-six \$1,500 scholarships to these great area high school seniors. She then proceeded to welcome the crowd of student scholars, their parents, educators, and school staff to our Scholarship Day—one of our favorite meetings. Claire said she had been a longtime former teacher at Pioneer High School and is proud to be Kiwanian because of the community activism and service that she can provide to our community through this club. This involvement allows her to vote every day for the kind of community in which she wants to live. She said that the people in the room also share this commitment to our future and that is something we all need to celebrate. She congratulated the students on each having a high school career of which they could be proud. She then had all student scholars stand for a hearty round of applause. She thanked the members of the Ann Arbor Public Schools staff, and the parents for their hard work and dedication in helping these students achieve their merited scholarships.

Claire introduced the first 13 scholarship winners. The first ten were Memorial Scholarships awarded to honor distinguished past members of our club. Claire noted that these scholarships are funded from Thrift Sale proceeds and from the club budget. She asked the students and the school staff in attendance to please come and shop at our Thrift Sale on Friday and Saturday mornings to help support the grants and scholarships that we make. The next two scholarships were from **Robert Gray** and **Susan Smith** for students in celebration of excellence in STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics). The last of the 13 was awarded by **Alan Burg** and **Ken Hillenburg** to a student offering great promise, hope, and lots of family pride in any area they want to pursue.

Peter Schork then took the floor and told the audience our Kiwanis Club gives money to the needy and to charities in the Washtenaw county area. Over the years, we have given more than 6.2 million dollars. He announced the remaining 33 Scholarships—four from the Ray & Eleanor Cross Foundation, and the rest from collaboration between members and friends of the Kiwanis Club of Ann Arbor and the Ray & Eleanor Cross Foundation. ~Continued on Page 3.

Ray Cross had over 41 years of perfect attendance at our club before he passed away in 2006. He started out at Pontiac High School and from there attended what is now Michigan Technological University. He went there so long ago that his tuition was zero, but books cost him twelve dollars. Ray was an amazing guy—graduating in four years with both a Bachelor's and a Master's Degree. Ray then worked in the Ann Arbor area for many years. He was the Culligan Man here and was an expert in all things water and water quality. He was also the president of the Water Quality Association, which is an international water treatment group. Ray's wife, Eleanor, was a longtime volunteer at Saint Andrews Episcopal Church. Ray also volunteered at Planned Parenthood and loved music. The Ann Arbor Symphony is now the beneficiary of that love.

The Ray & Eleanor Cross Foundation was established 18 or 19 years ago and was set up as a nonprofit to help three entities: The Saint Andrews Episcopal Church, The Ann Arbor Symphony, and our Kiwanis Club. Since it was started, the Foundation has given the three entities over a million dollars with more than \$450,000 going to our club—"amazing" as Peter said. The Cross Foundation is headed by a board of directors led by Ray & Eleanor's son and Kiwanis member, **Harry Cross**. Several members of the Cross family attended today's meeting.

In closing, Superintendent of the Ann Arbor Public School System, Dr. Jeanice Kerr Swift, noted that this is an impressive group of young people. She said 'It Takes a Village' as she thanked Kiwanians for believing and investing in the futures of each of these students. She also thanked the parents noting these students don't show up here by chance. It is because of all of our efforts, including Parents, School Staff, and Kiwanians helping them learn what is needed in achieving this high level of success. She congratulated the seniors on all they have accomplished and told them she is proud of them and the way they have excelled. She also encouraged the scholars to keep attending class; reminding them this is not the end of the school year. She said there is a lot of bad news in the world, but that these students are our great news of the day. She ended by saying she knows they will do well wherever they land and she hopes when it is their turn; they will 'pay it forward' just as we, here at Kiwanis, have done for them.
