TODAY'S PROGRAM...*League of Women Voters*

Kathie Wilder introduced our speaker for the day, Margaret Leary with the League of Women Voters of Michigan. Margaret spent 27 years as the director of the University of Michigan Law Library and holds a BA from Cornell University, an MA from the University of Minnesota, School of Library Science and a JD from the William Mitchell College of Law. She is very active in many facets of the Ann Arbor community. She spoke to us today about Proposal 2: Independent Redistricting Commission which appears on the Michigan ballot for the general election on November 6th, 2018. Margaret first spoke about her involvement in the League of Women Voters which is a non-partisan group that was created in 1920 (when women were granted the right to vote) and focus on public policy issues, especially those that affect voting rights. They do not support any political candidates or parties.

What is redistricting? It's re-drawing the lines for the legislative districts for the US Congress, Michigan House of Representatives, and the Michigan Senate. In Michigan, legislators currently draw the lines which has led to one of the worst cases of Gerry Mandering (drawing of the lines to suit special interests). There is currently no requirement for these lines to be drawn in public and also no set process for determining them. Gerry Mandering has been happening for years and began in Massachusetts after Elbridge Gerry drew a map that resembled something like a salamander and people decided to combine the two and change the way his name is pronounced to get the term "Gerry Mandering." According to a Princeton study, there are three measures of determining how gerrymandered a state's legislative lines are and Michigan scored high in all three categories. Two other states, Pennsylvania and North Carolina also scored high but have had court cases which have changed the way their lines are drawn leaving Michigan to be the worst offender. In order for lines to avoid Gerry Mandering, lines must create districts that are both compact and fair. There are two main methods used for creating unfair districts and these are: packing and cracking. Cracking involves dividing up people who are likely to vote in a certain way so that there is never a majority to elect anyone. Packing involves concentrating as many voters of one type into a single electoral district to reduce their influence in other districts. Michigan currently has 14 congressional districts. The 14th district is currently very Gerry mandered with a district that is 79% democratic and over 80% African American.

What are the results of Gerry Mandering? Seats won do not reflect votes cast, voters feel their votes don't count, vast majority of districts aren't competitive and the party in power meets behind closed doors and draws voting maps to its benefit. How did this happen? For those wanting to learn more, Margaret recommends checking out the book "Ratfu**ked, The True Story Behind the Secret Plan to Steal America's Democracy" by David Daley. It details the RED-MAP project. What are our options for change? States currently use 5 different ways of creating district lines: 1. Legislative committee creates a map for final legislative approval (31 states) 2. Advisory committee drafts a plan, but it is subject to legislative approval (5 states) 3. Politician created – designated elected officials comprise commission and draw final maps (7 states) 4. Independent Commission – citizens raw maps with no approval from legislature required (6 states) 5. Iowa – non-partisan legislative staff draws them (only state that does this). Proposal 2 on the Michigan ballot most closely reflects California's current system of drawing lines where there are 14 members – 5 democrats, 5 republicans, 4 neither party - who will be randomly selected by the Secretary of State and will prohibit certain people from being involved in the process. This group of people will then be in charge of creating the voting districts in Michigan every 10 years. There are many organizations across the state who publicly support proposal 2 including the League of Women Voters Michigan. This proposal is in place to make the process of drawing election maps transparent, impartial and fair and helps voter's voices to be heard and votes count. Get out there and vote on November 6th, 2018 and make your voice heard!!
