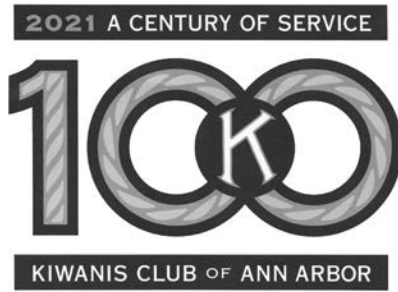

A2KIWANIS LOOKS BACK with PRIDE and FORWARD with ANTICIPATION

OUR CLUB anticipates a year full of new activities and exciting challenges to facilitate our growth and outreach.

But we also look back on the previous year with pride.

In 2023, we were pleased to return to in-person meetings (with a Zoom hybrid option) after a long COVID-induced period of remote connections. In June, we belatedly celebrated our Club's centennial with a week of special events.

We began implementing the five-year strategic plan completed in FY 2021-22 under the leadership of then President Ellen Webb. Our members adopted new Foundation bylaws to separate the Club and Foundation boards so we could protect the Foundation's status as a tax-exempt charity, while also creating additional leadership opportunities for our members.

We updated the Foundation's structure to keep pace with the impressive growth of the Thrift Sale, which allows us to have an increasing impact on our Foundation's charitable giving here in Washtenaw County. We are helping record numbers of children and families live better lives.

The healthy growth of Thrift Sale revenues created a need for professional management, and our strategic plan called for our first full-time executive director. The Foundation's bylaws were rewritten to clarify the executive director's role and responsibilities, and Mary Buck was hired in May of 2023.

Meanwhile, we needed some organizational restructuring to protect the Foundation's



IRS 501(C)(3) charitable organization status. We completely separated the boards of directors for the Club and Foundation. The office of Foundation President was abolished in favor of the executive director. The Foundation Board now has an elected chairperson, Past President Michael Dabbs, who will preside over the Board's meetings, while Club President Mary Stewart presides over Club activities and committees.

These changes and others not only fulfill the strategic plans, they ensure that our Club will continue our role as a vibrant community of do-ers who support the Foundation's growing charitable activities—and so much more.

WELCOME to MARY BUCK

Executive Director

During our Centennial celebration in June 2023, U.S. Representative Debbie Dingell met our new executive director, Mary Buck (l).



LAST YEAR, A2Kiwanis realized that booming Thrift Sale revenues, a strong volunteer organization, a large facility, and urgent community needs signaled the time was right to launch a nation-wide search for our first executive director.

The search ended when we found Michigan native and Michigan State University graduate Mary Buck in Santa Cruz, where she was managing a seniors-helping-seniors nonprofit called Grey Bears.

Like A2Kiwanis, the 500-member organization raises revenue for community work by running a thrift center. In California, Mary supervised 48 staff members, two recycling yards, and food delivery services. But, fortunately for us, Mary and her husband Zach whole-heartedly returned to Ann Arbor, so Mary could work to support the mission of Kiwanis.

“The needs are different here, but the hearts are the same,” Mary says. She arrived just in time to help our chapter celebrate our centennial.

“I’m impressed with the way Kiwanis uses this tremendous facility on behalf of the

entire community,” she tells visitors on a tour of the showroom. In the second half of her first year here, the Kiwanis Center served as a polling place; housed Red Cross blood drives; hosted a Mott Hospital retreat; and worked with more than 100 regular volunteers who ensure the Thrift Sale departments are well organized and well run.

“We hope to collaborate with many more community organizations, and become more diverse and open, to advance our Mission to provide for the needs of children and families throughout our county,” Mary says. “Everyone here—the donors, shoppers, staff, volunteers, and members—contribute to a circular economy that serves our neighbors who are most in need. This reflects Kiwanis’s commitment to a healthy community, the environment, and creates a more just world. We’re intending to build on this excitement.

WE GIVE!

OUR MISSION is to help children and families—and, thanks to the overwhelming success of the Thrift Sale, our impact is greater than ever before. For the second year in a row, in 2023, our outgoing philanthropic gifts surpassed \$1 million in cash grants, scholarships, merchandise donations, and direct flow-through donations. In 2023, **we set a new philanthropic record of disbursement: \$1,111,829.**

Our **FY23 income** amounted to \$2,160,103, including \$1,704,748 in Thrift Sale revenues and \$455,355 in rentals and lease income. We also hired a professional executive director and voted to purchase 3.79 acres and two buildings adjacent to the Kiwanis Center with a five-year land contract for \$555,000.

GIFTS

We awarded \$403,074 to **83 agencies**, including **six middle schools, the Michigan Law Enforcement Academy, YMCA Music Camp, and the Kids' Triathlon.**

We earmarked six grants and donations totaling \$22,626 to the Kiwanis of Michigan Foundation to support **University of Michigan Child and Life Services** at four Michigan's hospitals, **Kiwanis Student Service Leadership Programs, Kiwanis Children's Fund, and the Petánque Court** in Burns Park. Our Kiwanis Golf outing and individual members' donations contributed to that total.

Launched in FY2019, our **Washtenaw Community College Foundation Scholarship Program** reflects our mission to serve children and families in Washtenaw County. Last year, we proudly donated \$94,250 for scholarships. In the past five years, we have contributed \$418,000 to the foundation, assisting approximately 100 students with full-ride scholarships and emergency funds. One scholarship (\$3,500) covers tuition, books, and fees for an entire school year and can be renewed for a second year. Recipients represent the school districts of Arbor Prep, Central Academy in Ann Arbor, Chelsea, Dexter, Huron, Lincoln, Pathways to Success in Ann Arbor, Pioneer, Saline, Skyline, Washtenaw International High School in Ypsilanti, Washtenaw Technical Middle College at WCC, and Ypsilanti Community High.

Other donations directly impact our Kiwanis community: \$8,836 to the **Salvation Army** Bell-Ringing Campaign; \$96,522 to the **Warm the Children (WTC)** campaign (giving new winter clothing to 1,016 children); and \$7,230 to the **Haiti Nursing Foundation.**

Our non-cash direct donations included \$82,512 worth of **merchandise** to 294 individuals or families through our voucher program, and \$391,085 of free merchandise to 37 agencies.

All this was made possible by the generous gifts of time, talent, and treasure from our A2Kiwanis members and our dedicated staff of volunteers and employees. Thank you!

Our Mission: **SERVING the CHILDREN of the WORLD**



“DON’T WORRY! There’s plenty inside for everyone,” a volunteer traffic controller tells an impatient driver whose car is snaking slowly toward the Kiwanis Thrift Sale. This scene is reproduced almost every Friday and Saturday morning.

The volunteer is right: the former Sheridan Books facility displays and sells an astounding array of furniture, books, clothes, clocks, appliances, tools, workout equipment, and even fine art. Serving the Children of the World is the mission of the Ann Arbor Chapter of Kiwanis International, and the thrift sale funds that mission. Since our founding, we have made significant contributions to the lives of children and their families locally, regionally, nationally, and internationally.

Cars, trucks, and vans loaded with household items deposit their donations on

the loading dock while shoppers browse through the huge and meticulously organized warehouse. Behind the scenes, an army of volunteers—175 strong, some of whom aren’t even Kiwanis members—is hard at work sorting, cleaning, repairing, hanging, organizing, arranging, and displaying. Together, they average 1,000 hours every year, and many come in early in the week, to prepare goods for the next sale.

The Thrift Sale helps both donors and customers at every stage of life: setting up housekeeping, welcoming a new baby, furnishing college or newlywed apartments, moving elderly parents, downsizing, and responding to families dealing with tragedies. Every week, families in crisis receive free furniture and clothing vouchers.

Every so often, we chance upon unusual donations, and this year was no exception. We received an extraordinary collection of African art—masks, figures, sculptures, weapons—from the family of a deceased university professor. Volunteers are researching the artworks' history and will offer them at a private sale.

In the last eight years alone—despite two years of Covid shutdown—our chapter raised \$6,292,784 from its twice-weekly thrift store sales, and last year we donated a whopping \$1,084,424 to community organizations—about 30 percent more than any previous year.

But that's not the extent of our impact. This year, Kiwanis members also delivered nearly 7,000 Meals on Wheels, participated in Mott Children's Hospital programs, sent members to Haiti to work with the Haiti Nursing Foundation, and supported UNICEF's efforts to eliminate Maternal Neonatal Tetanus (MNT) and Iodine Deficiency Disorders (IDD) around the world.

In addition, individual members run student leadership programs, support the Salvation Army bell-ringing campaign, supervise blood drives, work with youth programs, support Kids Coalition Against Hunger, fund scholarships for Washtenaw students, donate and deliver winter clothing as part of its Warm the Children program, and respond to national and international emergencies to assist victims of earthquakes, floods, and hurricanes.



OUR HISTORY & MISSION

Kiwanis International was launched in Detroit on January 21, 1915, originally to promote business networking. The name means “we build” in the Algonquian language. Within four years, the organization shifted its focus to community service, and in 1919, Kiwanis became international when a chapter opened in Hamilton, Ontario. On May 13, 1921, sixty local philanthropists launched Kiwanis's 457th chapter in Ann Arbor.

As of October 2022, we are the largest club in Michigan, with 141 members.

We have six objectives: to “focus on the human and spiritual rather than the material values of life;” encourage a daily commitment to the Golden Rule; promote “higher social, business, and professional standards;” develop “a more intelligent, aggressive, and serviceable citizenship;” encourage enduring friendships; and build better communities, with “righteousness, justice, patriotism, and good will.”

In 2017, we launched the Ann Arbor Warm the Children program

As soon as our chapter was founded, we began providing recreation and education for young patients at the University of Michigan Hospital. Initially, our fundraising relied upon rummage sales and food sales. Eventually we acquired a permanent sales center in downtown Ann Arbor, at 200 S. First Street. In 1934, the project was adopted by our Michigan District and named for Forney W. Clement, a former district secretary and club member. Over time, it has expanded to include programs in the Mary Free Bed Hospital in Grand Rapids (1961), Northern Michigan Hospitals, Inc., in Petoskey (1977), and Children's Hospital of Michigan in Detroit (1980s). Our members also support the Child and Family Life Program at C.S. Mott Children's Hospital.

In 2017, we launched the Ann Arbor Warm the Children program. We also donate countless boxes of books to schools and literacy programs, and help with Children's Cancer Camp, Red Cross blood drives, Christmas in April, and in-school educational programs.

WE CONTINUE TO GROW & EXPAND OUR COMMUNITY IMPACT

Originally, our chapter met downtown, in the building on the southwest corner of First and Washington streets. As membership expanded, John E. Swisher Jr. spearheaded the purchase of his family's former wholesale grocery store, at 200 S. First Street, to honor his father, a former president. This helped the club expand its vision and impact. We decided we had outgrown our headquarters by 2015, which

is when the Sheridan Books facility was put up for sale. We jumped at the opportunity to expand our presence.

At first, volunteers divided their efforts between the two locations, but that quickly became unmanageable, so we sold the downtown location, and all club activities moved into the Kiwanis Center on North Stabler Road, which allowed us to collect and distribute massive quantities of donations. That launched a period of remarkable growth that continues today. We are good stewards. We rent our center's excess space to a book distributor, and we rent the house that is located on our 17.4-acre property—those rental incomes helped us survive the Covid shutdown. But we devote more than half of our 123,000-square-foot building to salesrooms, work rooms, storage, meeting rooms, administration, maintenance, and community services. We also host blood drives, corporate retreats, polling stations, and community gatherings here.

Since reopening after the shutdown, sales revenues from the thrift shop skyrocketed. We quickly realized that our scope had broadened too wide to rely on volunteer help alone. Last year, members voted to divide the president's job in two: a president for the foundation and a president for the club. And we decided the time had come for a paid, full-time director.

After a national search, Michigan native and MSU graduate Mary Buck moved into the director's office in May. She

supervises a staff of seventeen, a volunteer crew of 175, Kiwanis committees, and—literally—the tons of donations that arrive each year at our huge center.

MAKING A DIFFERENCE

In our first 92 years, our chapter donated \$5.7 million to the community. That figure nearly doubled in the last eight years alone, despite Covid's impact. Although many of our donations range between \$500 and \$4,000, in recent years, we have contributed \$104,000 to the worldwide Iodine Deficiency Disorder project, more than \$103,000 to Kiwanis/UNICEF's worldwide project to eliminate maternal and neonatal tetanus, and more than \$112,000 to the Haiti Nursing Foundation.

And we have even bigger plans for the future.

We have designated 7.5 acres of our property as the Ann Arbor Kiwanis Environmental Education Preserve (A2KEEP), where we intend to create educational materials and pathways around its ponds and marshes and through the woodland, for use by school children, environmental groups, and community organizations. We have blueprints for a pavilion that will serve as an outdoor classroom.

Last year's president, Steve Hiller, explained, "Years ago, I wanted to get involved in an organization with strong goals and a commitment to give back to the community." By the end of his first meeting, in 2004, he knew he'd found what he was looking for. "This is a very rewarding organization."
